She has been a Lecturer in Public International Law and International Relations at Zaragoza University (Spain) since 2000 and Full Professor of Public International Law and International Relations from 2018. She specialises in International Human Rights Law, International Criminal Justice, Peacekeeping Operations, Use of Force and Defence Policies, and Theory and History of International Law.

She has taught Public International Law and International Relations, International Organizations, International Human Rights Law, European Union Law (at first degree level) and the International Human Rights Law (at doctoral level). From 2018, she has also held the post of Coordinator of the Ph.D. Program of Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms. In

May 2021, she was elected President of the Ph.D. Commission of the University of Zaragoza (Spain).

She has been a Visiting Fellow at The Lauterpacht Centre for International Law, University of Cambridge (2009); Visiting Researcher (as Fellow 'Salvador de Madariaga' of Spanish Ministry of Education) at the Institute for Global Law and Policy (Harvard Law School) and Fellow at the Royal Complutense College at Harvard (2012), and Visiting Fellow at the Max Planck Institute for Comparative Public Law and International Law in Heidelberg (2014).
